ACCEPTANCE OF THE AGENDA

Klein moved and Nissly seconded to accept the agenda as written.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

2. **Bond Financing**

of the City of Iowa Falls, State of Iowa. There were no oral or written comments. Mayor Emerson closed the public hearing.

3. Wastewater Treatment Plant

Cutler moved and Thies seconded to approve the Antidegradation Alternatives Analysis Report for the Wastewater Treatment Plant by FOX Strand.

4. River Road Improvement Projects

Klein moved and Gritsch seconded to approve the Professional Services Agreement with Impact7G to conduct a Wetland Delineation Review in the amount of \$5,220.00 funded with 80% LOST

5. **FY2022-2023 Budget**

- a. Mayor Emerson opened the public hearing on the adoption of the FY2022-2023 Budget. City Manager Anderson reported that they were able to hold the levy the same as last year. There were no further oral or written comments. Mayor Emerson closed the public hearing.
- b. Cutler moved and Nissly seconded to approve Resolution No. 2022-21 adopting the FY2022-2023 Budget and certifying taxes.

6. Airport Projects

a. Nissly moved and Klein seconded to approve payment to McClure Engineering Co. in the amount of \$6,849.68 for construction administration and observation for the Construct Taxiway B Project.

b. Gritsch moved and Thies seconded to approve payment to McClure Engineering Co. in the amount of \$4,998.91 for construction administration and observation for the Rehabilitate Runway 13/31 Project.

Carl and Wendy Lewis rescinded their offer to purchase the property at 1022 Sherman.

11. Police Department

a. Klein moved and Gritsch seconded to approve the purchase of two patrol vehicles one in the amount of \$21,480.00 and the other in the amount of \$34,714.00 approved in the Capital Improvement Program.

b. Cutler moved and Gritsch seconded to approve the bid to repair drywall sections at the Police Station in the amount of \$5,569.21 with the funds coming from Fund 78 Building Maintenance.

12. Hotel and Motel Tax Advisory Board

a. Cutler moved and Klein seconded to approve Resolution No. 2022-22 revising the Hotel and Motel Tax Funding Advisory Board Member requirements to a seven-member Board with one representative from Chamber/Main Street, one representative from Iowa Falls Area Development Corporation, one representative from the Scenic City Empress Boat Club, two representatives from the City Council and two members at-large.

b. Cutler moved and Thies seconded to approve the appointments of Michelle Gritsch and Micah Cutler as Council representatives, Adam Nederhoff as Chamber representative and Travis Woodley as an at-large representative.

Vote: Cutler, Thies, Nissly, Klein and Gritsch voting aye.

13. Closed Session

Nissly moved and Thies seconded to go into closed session as allowed in Iowa Code Section 21.5.1.j to discuss land acquisition and disposal and Iowa Code Section 21.5.1.c to discuss possible litigation.

Nissly moved and Klein seconded to go back into open session having taken no action in closed session.
