Landfill Information

Hours:

Weekdays	8:00 a.m. - 3:00 p.m.
Last Saturday of each month	9:00 a.m. - 11:00 a.m.

Policies:

Covered Loads:

All loads **MUST BE COVERED** or will be turned away or **FINED**.

Wind:

When the wind speed reaches 25 mph or greater, the landfill will close.

Call ahead before coming to the landfill.

Fees:

Regular Waste	\$45 per ton
Special Waste (i.e. Asbestos)	\$50 per ton

If your material is separated in your loads to the landfill this will help in disposing the material.

Items NOT Accepted:

- Free liquids
- Machinery
- Dead animals
- Hazardous waste
- Steel cable
- Flexible augers
- Metal wire
- Large chunks of rubble
- Trees or branches

Yard Waste:

The landfill does accept leaves, yard and garden waste. All yard waste must be placed in a biodegradable bag (paper) or if placed in a plastic bag, the bag must be taken with you. All loads must be covered.

Recycling Information

Recycling Bins can be obtained by calling Hardin Co. Solid Waste at 641-939-5808.

Recycling is picked up every other week on your normal day of collection

Items Accepted:

- #1 through #7 Plastic
- Tin
- Corrugated Cardboard
- Paper:
 - News
 - Bulk Mail
 - Shredded Materials (placed in a bag)
 - Books
 - Magazines
- Paper Board:
 - Cake Mix boxes
 - Cereal boxes

Items NOT Accepted:

- Glass of any kind
- Pizza boxes
- Chicken boxes
- Egg cartons
- Any container with ANY type of oil
- Styrofoam of any kind
- Un-rinsed items

Preparation of Materials for Collection and Processing:

Plastic:

Remove lids and throw away; rinse and clean

Tin:

Remove lids and throw away; remove labels; rinse and clean

Corrugated Cardboard:

Clean, emptied, flattened

No larger than 2 feet by 4 feet

Paper Items (Separate by categories):

News - newspaper and all inserts; place in a grocery sack and tied closed

Bulk Mail - place in separate grocery sack and tied closed

Magazines - place in separate grocery sack and tied closed

Recycling Information Continued

Curbside Customers:

- Place Red Bin at Curb by 7:30 a.m.
- Place ALL materials in your bin; except large flattened cardboard which should be placed under your bin
- Place all loose materials in the bottom of your bin, placing the tied grocery sacks on top of the loose materials

Appliances:

Appliances are accepted at the Recycling Center for a fee; includes garage door openers. Call Hardin County Solid Waste for current fees. Light ballasts are \$8.00 each.

Scrap Metal:

Metal is accepted at a cost of \$45.00 per ton. All wood, plastic and concrete must be removed. **Please separate metal from landfill material.**

Tires:

Car tires \$3.00 each

Tires on rims \$5.00 each

Maximum 4 car tires or weighted and charged bulk rate of \$0.10 per pound

Household Hazardous Waste:

Accepted by appointment ONLY from May to September

What should NEVER be placed in a recycling bin?

The following items should never be placed in your recycling bin: garbage, hazardous chemicals, oil, antifreeze, paint, food scraps, dirty diapers, glass, needles or sharps, Styrofoam or peanuts, pizza boxes, chicken boxes, ceramics, egg cartons and cooking/motor oil container

Why aren't these Recycled?

Un-rinsed containers, garbage and hazardous chemicals are dangerous to the people who collect recyclables and work in the Recycling Center.

Unacceptable materials sent to the Recycling Center must be land filled, which increases program costs.
