CITY OF IOWA FALLS REGULAR MEETING NOVEMBER 20, 2023

The Mayor and City Council of the City of Iowa Falls met in regular session on Monday, November 20, 2023 at 6:30 p.m. with Mayor Michael R. Emerson presiding over the meeting. Council Members Micah Cutler, Michelle Gritsch, Steve Klein, Roger Nissly and Bruce Thies were present. Also present was City Manager Jody Anderson.

ACCEPTANCE OF THE AGENDA

Thies moved and Nissly seconded to accept the agenda as written.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Klein moved and Gritsch seconded to approve the minutes from the Regular Meeting of October 16, 2023, Special Meeting of October 23, 2023 and the Special Meeting of November 9, 2023.

a. Thies moved and Cutler seconded to approve funding the demolition of the building from 20% LOST in the amount of \$47,848.00 with the funding coming from 20% LOST – Community Housing Program.

- a. Mayor Emerson opened the public hearing on the Upper Palisades West Development Agreement to expand for residential development. There were no oral or written comments. Mayor Emerson closed the public hearing.
- b. Klein moved and Thies seconded to approve the Upper Palisades West Development Agreement to expand for residential development.

- c. Mayor Emerson opened the public hearing on approval of the final plat for Lower Palisades West. Kathy and John Ritzler of 2428 River Road shared their concerns and asked if the speed limit could be lowered on River Road. City Manager Jody Anderson reported that there could possibly be more street lights out in the area. Chris Weaver asked if the shoulder width could be widened. Robin Sampson, Manager of the Palisades Land Development Company stated that they have been working with the neighbors. There was no further public comment. Mayor Emerson closed the public hearing.
- d. Nissly moved and Klein seconded to approve Resolution No. 2023-44 approving the Preliminary Plat of Palisades Estates, Plat 1, City of Iowa Falls, Hardin County, Iowa.

9. **Heritage Estates Final Plat**

- a. Mayor Emerson opened the public hearing on approval the final plat for Heritage Estates. Micah Cutler asked if the plat was the same as the previous one, it was reported that it was the same. There was no further comment. Mayor Emerson closed the public hearing.

10. Airport Rehabilitate Taxiway A

- b. Thies moved and Klein seconded to approve the Geotechnical Investigation for the Rehabilitate Taxiway A Project in the amount of \$7,250.00. Roll Vote: Thies, Klein, Gritsch, Nissly and Cutler voting aye.

11. **1014 Main Street**

a. Thies moved and Nissly seconded to approve the cost of demolition of the structure at 1014 Main in the amount of \$15,712.50 with the funds coming from 20% LOST – Community Housing Program.

- b. Mayor Emerson opened the public hearing on the sale of the vacant lot at 1014 Main Street. There were no oral or written comments. Mayor Emerson closed the public hearing.
- c. Klein moved and Cutler seconded to approve Resolution No. 2023-48 approving the sale of the vacant lot at 1014 Main Street to Sarah and Sean Palmer for a purchase price of \$1,700.00.

NEW BUSINESS

12. Offer to Purchase Property

Klein moved and Nissly seconded to approve Resolution NO. 2023-49 tentatively approving the sale of 320 Talbott, 322 Talbott and 209 Estes to England Rentals and setting a public hearing for the December 18, 2023, Regular City Council meeting on the sale of the properties and to get costs to clear the 209 Estes property from the training burn.

13. Meyer Municipal Aquatic Center

Gritsch moved and Thies seconded to authorize staff to obtain bids for the electrical service work needed.

14. CDBG Housing Upper Story Conversion

- a. Mayor Emerson opened the public hearing on the proposed project application for an Iowa Economic Development Authority CDBG Housing Upper Story Conversion for the Princess Grill and Pizzeria at 607 Washington Avenue. Marty Wymore with Region 6 reported that a building in downtown Iowa Falls located at 607 Washington Avenue has space in its upper story to be converted into housing units. More housing units are needed in the community, and this space in a downtown building is underutilized. The project will add two two-bedroom housing units, both of which will have rents that are affordable for LMI households. The total budget for the housing conversion project and CDBG admin is \$755,000. The CDBG request is \$600,000 (\$550,000 for construction and administration and \$50,000 for green items solar panels). The building owner cash contribution is \$115,000, and city contribution is \$40,000. 100% of the funds will benefit LMI individuals. A community development and housing need assessment was prepared as part of the public hearing. There was no further comment. Mayor Emerson closed the public hearing.
- b. Klein moved and Cutler seconded to approve Resolution No. 2023-50 to approve application for the Iowa Economic Development Authority Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) program for upper story housing conversion and to fund the City's share from CDBG LMI funds.

Roll Vote: Klein, Cutler, Thies, Gritsch and Nissly voting aye.

15. Water Department

Shannon Hazelton discussed the purchase of a different type of water meter.

16. **Annual Financial Reports**

a. Cutler moved and Gritsch seconded to approve the Annual Financial Report.

b. Gritsch moved and Nissly seconded to approve the Annual Urban Renewal Report.

c. Cutler moved and Thies seconded to approve Resolution No. 2023-51 directing the filing of certification under Iowa Code Section 403.19 for Iowa Falls Tax Increment Financing.

17. Closed Session

Thies moved and Cutler seconded to go into closed session as allowed in Iowa Code Section 21.5.1.j to discuss land acquisition and disposal.

Cutler moved and Klein seconded to go back into open session having taken no action in closed session.
